It is officially announced that Dan Breen, one of the best-known of the irregular leaders, was captured in a dug-out with two others, Tim Donovan and M. Walsh, at Longford, Glen of Aherlow, yesterday morning.

Our special reporter in Dublin wired last night—Army Headquarters issued the following report to-day:—Troops of the Limerick Command operating in the Glen of Aherlow today captured Dan Breen, Timothy Donovan, Walsh, Jeremiah Ryan and James Ryan.

The physician states that his death was due to natural causes.—Heater.

The troops believed they had the key to the situation. Two of them got through the crevice. They encountered a barrier a few feet high, which they got through, and a few yards further in they found another barrier, and while removing it they were opened on them from the inside of the cave, and Vol. O'Neill, of the Dublin Guards, 4th, 2nd street, Dublin, fell mortally wounded.
